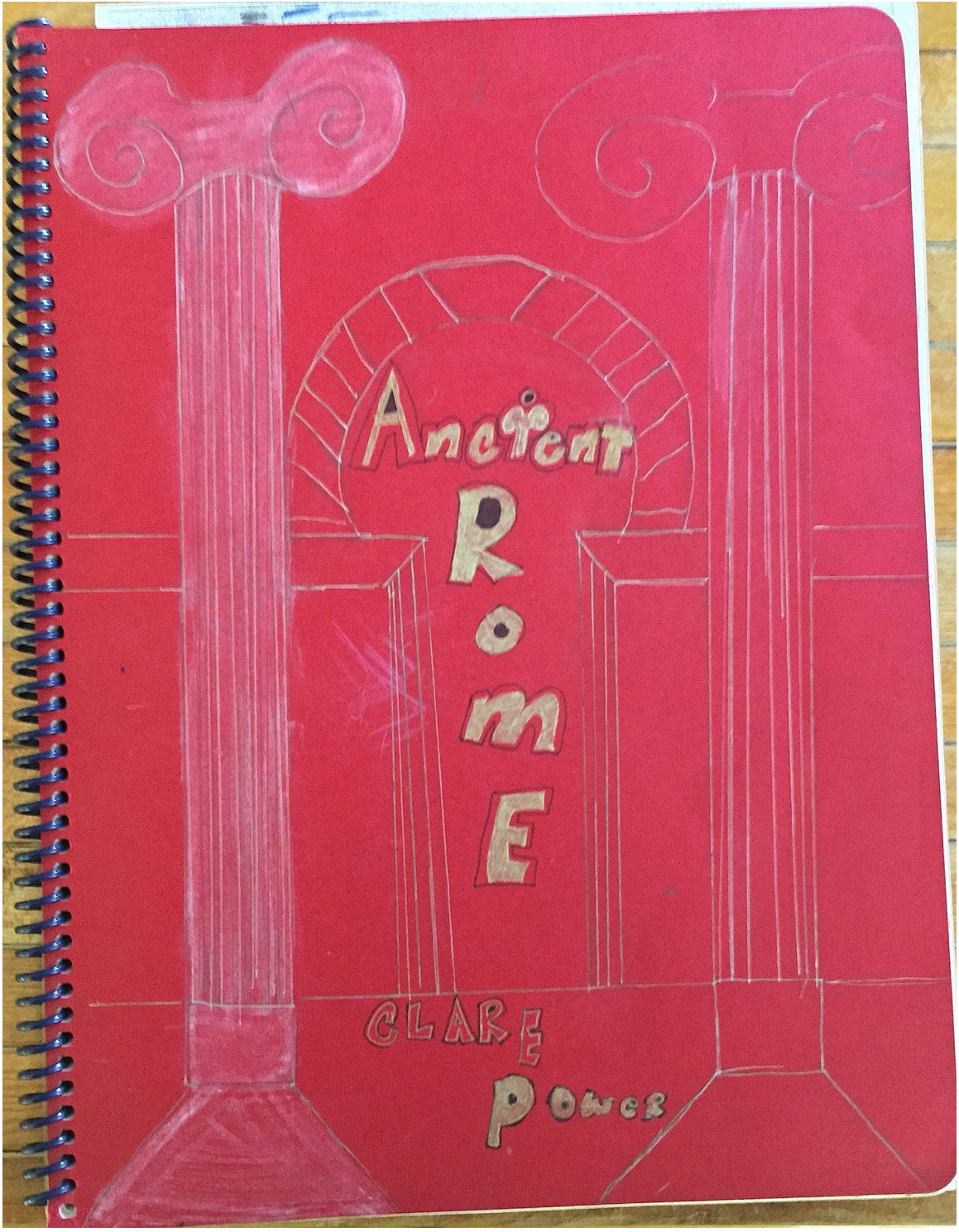


Sixth Grade Roman History Main Lesson Book

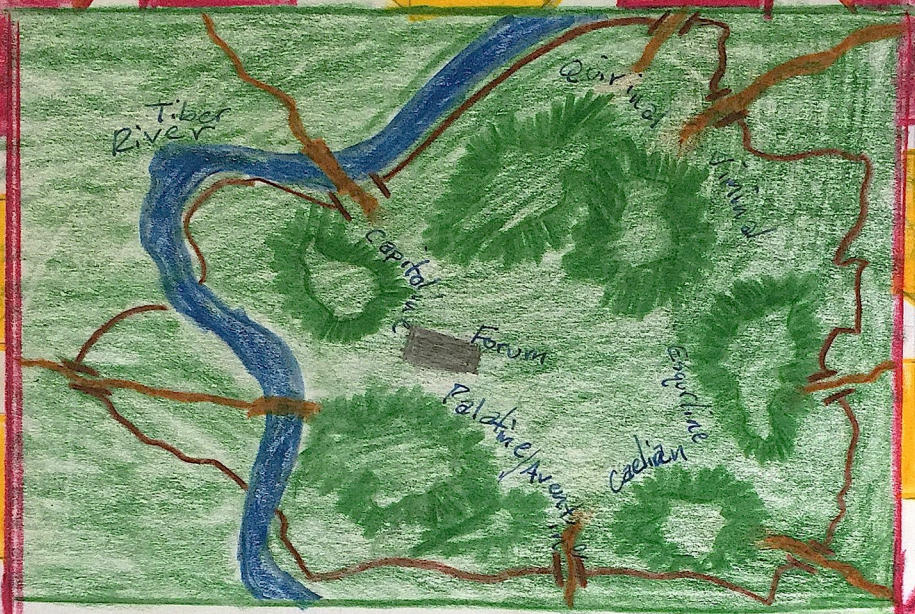

Romulus and Remus

Romulus and Remus were the twin sons of Rhea Sylvia, a Vestal virgin, and Ares, the God of War. Amulius, the great uncle of the twins, put them in a pig trough and threw them into the Tiber river hoping that they would die. As the boys travelled along the cold river, their father's hand guided them. He guided them to a she wolf where he wished for her to take care of them. The she wolf nursed the boys but, one day she left the boys in the cave so she could go hunting. Meantime there was a shepherd named Faustulus herding his sheep near the wolf's cave, he heard a noise, a crying noise. He went over to the dark cave and saw the twins crying. He took them home to his wife and they raised them as their own. They told the boys when they got older about their mother Rhea and father Ares and how their great uncle planned to kill them and how he killed their grandfather, King of Alba Longa. So the boys travelled into the city and killed their great uncle with their shepherd staffs. After killing their great uncle the boys and three thousand men left for a new place where they founded Rome.



7 Hills of Rome

Latins	Viminal
Etruscans	Esquiline.
